GAST OF CHARACTERS

Indris	Avān. Pahmahjin-Nāsarāt fa Amonindris, formerly a knight of the Sēq Order of Scholars and now a daimahjin, a mercenary warrior-mage. Once commanded the Immortal Companions' nahdi company. Also known as Dragon-Eyed Indris; Indris, Tamer of Ghosts; and Indris, the Prince of Diamonds. Bears the mind blade, Changeling.
Ekko	Tau-se. Former Knight-Colonel of the Lion Guard First Company. Commanded the expedition to retrieve Far-ad-din after his escape. Now a jombe who travels with Indris.
Hayden Goode	Human. A drover turned adventurer and once a skirmisher for the Immortal Companions, who now travels with Indris. Expert rifleman.
Sassomon-Omen	Nomad. Became a Wraith Knight in the collapse of the Awakened Empire. Formerly an artist and philosopher, he became an infantryman with the Immortal Companions, and now travels with Indris.
Shar-fer-rayn	Seethe. War-chanter of the Rayn-ma troupe, reputed to be the last surviving member of her family. Met Indris in the slave pits of Sorochel, from which they escaped together. Now travels with Indris.

GREAT HOUSE OF NĀSARAT

Ariskander	Avān. Former Rahn-Nāsarāt, and Arbiter of the Change at the Battle of Amber Lake. Rahn of Nāsarāt Prefecture and Prefect of Narsis.
Nehrun	Avān. Pah-Nāsarāt and Ariskander's eldest child.
Roshana	Avān. Rahn-Nāsarāt, and commander of the First Whitehorse Company of Cataphracts. Ariskander's second child.
Tajaddin	Avān. Pah-Nāsarāt, Zienni Scholar, and Ariskander's third child.
Anani	Tau-se. Lion Guard.
Baniq	Human. Gnostic Assassin.
Bensaharēn	Avān. Poet Master of the Nāsé-sûk, the Phoenix School, in Narsis. Poet Master of the Great House of Nāsarāt. Also the Sayf-Nāsarīn, and distant cousin to the Great House of Nāsarāt. Called the Waterdancer. Bears the amenesqa, Rain.
Danyūn	Human. Member of the Ishahayans, and Master of Spies for the Great House of Nāsarāt.
Furu	Tau-se. Lion Guard.

Fyra	Human. Gnostic Assassin.
Kofo	Tau-se Lion Guard.
Maselane	Human. Sayf of the Family Ashour and Master of Arms for the Great House of Näsarat. Also Knight-General of the Näsarat Phoenix Armies.
Mauntro	Tau-se. Knight-Colonel of the Lion Guard.
Nsay	Tau-se Lion Guard.
Samu	Tau-se Lion Guard.
Zoer	Avān. Gnostic Assassin.
GREAT HOUSE OF EREBUS	
Basyrandin	Deceased. Avān. Imperialist. Corajidin's late father and four-time Asrahn of Shrīan.
Belamandris	Avān. Imperialist. Pah-Erebus, called the Widowmaker and leader of the Anlūki. Corajidin's second son. Born to Corajidin's second wife, Farha of the Dahrain. Warrior-poet of the Erebon-sūk. Bears the amenesqa, Tragedy.
Corajidin	Avān. Imperialist. Rahn-Erebus of Erebus Prefecture and Prefect of Erebesq.
Kasraman	Avān. Imperialist. Pah-Erebus and Corajidin's rahn-elect. Trained as an Angothic Witch by Wolfram. Son of Corajidin's first wife, Laleh of the Ars-Izrel.
Khurshad	Avān. Imperialist. Widow of the late Basyrandin, Corajidin's mother and the Dowager-Asrahn. Khurshad is currently the Sayf-Tamerlan.
Mariam	Avān. Federationist. Pah-Erebus, called the Queen of Swords. Former Knight-Major of the Feyassin. Born to Corajidin's second wife, Farha of the Dahrain.
Nima	Avān. Imperialist. Corajidin's nephew and warrior of the Anlūki.
Qarnassus	Deceased. Avān. Imperialist. Corajidin's grandfather and five-time Asrahn of Shrīan.
Yashamin	Avān. Corajidin's third wife, and former nemhoureh of the House of Pearl.
Armal	Avān. Imperialist. Thufan's son.
Brede	Human. Formerly a Sēq Librarian captured and turned by the Angothic Witches. Wolfram's apprentice.

Delfynn	Avān. Federationist. Poet-Master of the Vayen-sûk, and Poet Master to the Great House of Selassin.
Elonie	Human. Witch in service to the Great House of Erebus, released from the Mahsojhin.
Farouk	Avān. Imperialist. Corajidin's nephew and adjutant.
Ikedion	Human. Atrean born witch in service to the Great House of Erebus, released from the Mahsojhin.
Thufan	Deceased. Avān. Imperialist. Sayf-Charamin and Corajidin's Kherife-General and Spymaster. Prefect of Jafke. Killed by Erebus soldiers.
Wolfram	Human. Angothic Witch and Corajidin's Lore Master, and rajir. Originally took service with Corajidin's grandfather, Rahn-Erebus fa Qarnassus. Corajidin's close friend and adviser. Kasraman's teacher in the arcane.
Yotep	Avān. Warrior of the Anlūki.
GREAT HOUSE OF SELASSIN	
Afareen	Avān. Rahn-Selassin and wife of Asrahn-Vashne.
Daniush	Avān. Pah-Selassin and Vashne's rahn-elect. Murdered by Corajidin.
Hamejin	Deceased. Avān. Pah-Selassin and Vashne's second son. Murdered by Erebus soldiers.
Martūm	Avān. The Selassin Rahn-Elect and Vashne's cousin.
Vahineh	Avān. Rahn-Selassin and Vashne's only daughter. Third child of Vashne and Afareen.
Vashne	Deceased. Avān. Rahn-Selassin and Asrahn of Shrīan. Prefect of Qeme. Murdered by Corajidin.
Sadra	Human. Vahineh's weapon-master.
Tarshin	Avān. Federationist. Poet-Master of the Vayen-sûk, and Poet Master to the Great House of Selassin.
GREAT HOUSE OF SÛN	
Navid	Avān. Pah-Sûn and Nazarafine's nephew. Warrior-poet of the Saidani-sûk, the 'Four Blades School.' Commander of Nazarafine's Sûnguard.
Nazarafine	Avān. Federationist. Rahn-Sûn of the Sûn Isles and Speaker for the People. Prefect of Qom Riyadh.

Osman	Avān. Federationist. Pah-Sûn, Rahn-Elect of the Sûn Isles and eldest brother of Navid, and Riam.
Riam	Avān. Federationist. Pah-Sûn and younger brother of Osman, and Navid. Warrior-poet of the Saidani-sûk, the 'Four Blades School', and graduate of the Zienni Scholars.
Jarrah	Avān. Poet Master of the Saidani-sûk, the Four Blades School, in Saidani. Poet Master of the Great House of Sûn.
GREAT HOUSE OF KADARIN	
Anankil	Avān. Federationist. Pah-Kadarin and Narseh's heir. Knight-General of the Yourdin, the elite Kadarin heavy infantry.
Narseh	Avān. Imperialist. Rahn-Kadarin and Knight-Marshal of Shrīan. Prefect of Kadariat.
Nirén	Avān. Poet Master of the Habron-sûk, the Heron School, in Avānweh. Poet Master of the Great House of Kadarin.
GREAT HOUSE OF BEY	
Harish	Avān. Federationist. Pah-Bey and Siamak's eldest son. Karia of Ifqe, Master of Arms to the Great House of Bey, and leader of the Marmûn, the elite warriors of the Rōmarq and Bey Prefecture.
Siamak	Avān. Federationist. Rahn-Bey of Bey Prefecture and Prefect of Beyjan and Amnon.
Umna	Avān. Federationist. Pah-Bey, Siamak's eldest daughter, and rahn-elect.
Vasanya	Avān. Federationist. Rahn-Bey and wife of Siamak. Formerly of Tanis.
Indera	Avān. Federationist. Poet Master of the Marmûn-sûk, and Poet Master to the Great House of Bey.
(FORMER) GREAT HOUSE OF DIN-MA (THE SEETHE DIN-MA TROUPE)	
Anj-el-din	Seethe. Pah-Nāsarāt. Far-ad-din's daughter and Indris's missing wife.
Far-ad-din	Exiled. Seethe. Rahn-Din-ma, deposed at the Battle of Amber Lake. Former Prefect of Amnon.
Ran-jar-din	Deceased. Seethe. Pah-Din-ma. Far-ad-din's rahn-elect. Killed by Belamandris at the Battle of Amber Lake.

THE EXILES

Feyd	Avān. Imperialist. Leader of the Jiharim. Corajidin's Master of Arms.
Jhem	Avān. Imperialist. Sayf-Delfineh and Corajidin's Master of Assassins. Known as the Blacknake.
Kimiya	Avān. Imperialist. Youngest daughter of Jhem, and Wolfram's apprentice.
Nadir	Avān. Imperialist. Son and eldest child of Jhem. Before his Exile, Nadir was Mari's lover, and a former student of the Nāsé-sûk.
Nix	Avān. Imperialist. Sayf-Malahdi and son of Rayz, the Ironweb.
Ravenet	Avān. Imperialist. Oldest daughter of Jhem.
Sanojé	Avān. Imperialist. Pah-Chepherundi. A Tanisian witch.
Tahj-Shaheh	Avān. Imperialist. Marble Sea corsair and daughter of Hatoub, the late Sayf-Nās-Sayyin. Corajidin's Sky Master and Master of the Fleet.

THE HUNDRED FAMILIES

Ajomandyan	Avān. Federationist. Sayf-Nāsiré and Prefect of Avānweh. Also referred to as the Sky Lord.
Bijan	Avān. Federationist. One of Vashne's and Ariskander's allies.
Cesare	Avān. Federationist. Sayf-Ashion and the Speaker for the People.
Chanq	Avān. Imperialist. Sayf-Joroccan and heavily involved in organized crime. One of Corajidin's supporters.
Dowager-Asrahn	Avān. Imperialist. Sayf-Khurshad of the Savajiin, Corajidin's Mother, wife of the late Basyrandin, and governor of Tamerlan. Also referred to as the Shark of Tamerlan.
Eladdin	Avān. Imperialist. Son of the Dowager-Asrahn and a warrior-poet of the Erebon-sûk. Called the Sidewinder.
Hadi	Avān. Imperialist. One of Corajidin's supporters.
Iraj	Deceased. Human. Federationist. One of Vashne's and Ariskander's allies, found murdered in Avānweh during the political purges.
Kiraj	Human. Neutral, though generally allied with the Federationists. Sayf-Masadhe and Prefect of Masadhe. Arbiter Marshal of Shrīan. One of Vashne's and Ariskander's allies.
Maroc	Avān. Imperialist. Sayf-Jayan and Prefect of Zam'Haja. Younger brother of Delfyne, the Poet Master of the Grieve.

Neva	Avān. Federationist. Ajomandyan's granddaughter and heir. Commands the Sky Knights of Avānweh, and performs in the Nāsiré Flying Cirq.
Rayz	Deceased? Exile. Imperialist. Former Sayf-Malahdi, and former Master of Assassins for the Great House of Erebus.
Teymoud	Avān. Imperialist. Sayf-Saidani and Magnate of the Mercantile Guildsman. Formerly one of Corajidin's supporters.
Yago	Avān. Federationist. Ajomandyan's grandson. A senior officer of the Sky Knights of Avānweh, and performs in the Nāsiré Flying Cirq.
Zendi	Avān. Imperialist. Sayf-Bajadeh. Runs bordellos in competition to the House of Pearl. One of Corajidin's supporters.
Ziaire	Avān. Federationist. Sayf-Manshira and Prime of Amajoram in Avānweh. One of the most celebrated nemhoureh of the House of Pearl. Head of the newly formed Peace Faction within the Teshri.
THE FEYASSIN	
Chelapa	Avān. Knight-Colonel of the Feyassin.
Mehran	Avān. Knight-Lieutenant of the Feyassin.
Qamran	Avān. Knight-Major of the Feyassin.
THE SEQ	
Ahwe	Avān. Sēq Magnate. One of the greatest of the Sēq, and one of Sedefke's first apprentices. Helped found the scholastic orders
Aumh	Y'arrow-ti-yi. Sēq Master and member of the Suret.
Cennoväl	Avān. Sēq Master, also known as the Dragonlord, and the only scholar aside from Indris and Anj-el-din to have travelled to the Spines, and returned.
Femensetri	Avān. Sēq Master and Scholar Marshal of Shrīan. Formerly Indris's teacher. Also known as the Stormbringer. Member of the Suret and one of those who helped found the scholastic orders.
He-Who-Watches	Avān. Sēq Master and member of the Suret. An orjini tribesman.
Kemenchromis	Avān. Sēq Master Magnate and Arch-Scholar. Twin brother of Femensetri. Lore Master and rajir to the Empress-in-Shadows. Prime of the Suret. Helped found the scholastic orders

Madiset	Avān. Sēq instructor and one of Indris's teachers at Amarqa-in-the-Snows.
Sedefke	Avān. Founder of the Sēq Order of Scholars, who discovered the process of soul binding with the consciousness of Īa, otherwise known as Awakening.
Taqrit	Avān. Sēq Inquisitor and one of the Eight. Childhood friend of Indris and Anj-el-din.
Yattoweh	Avān. Once, Sedefke's first and greatest disciple. Helped found the various scholastic orders.
Zadjinn	Avān. Sēq Master and member of the Great House of Erebus. Member of the Suret.
OTHERS	
Delfyne	Avān. Poet Master of the Grieve, also known as the Erebon-sûk, or the Stallion School, in Zam'Haja. Elder sister of Maroc.
Kembe	Tau-se. Patriarch of the Tau-se tribes and Protector of Taumarqan.
Kumeri	Nomad. Tanisian born Mahjirahn Chepherundi op Kumeri, Sanojé's Ancestor, now a lich.
Navaar	Avān/Human. High Palatine of Oragon.
Navaskar	Nomad. Tanisian born Pahavān Chepherundi ap Navaskar, Sanojé's Ancestor, now a lich.
The Emissary	An agent of the Drear, in league with Corajidin.
Tyen-to-wo	The Laughing Wind spirit of the Seethe.
